

Director's Notes - Chris Chambers

I have been inspired by the creativity of the cast and crew, bringing Jane's story to life on stage in such a dynamic way; their ability and openness to layer ideas through rehearsal, adjusting scenes continually, working in the props, music underscore and quick changes of costume, whilst always maintaining a collaborative energy and willingness to play.

The story-telling is episodic and fast-moving through the different stages of Jane's life, on one hand showing the events of her life, whilst on the other concentrating deeply on her inner life and response.

The relationship between Jane and Bertha has been cleverly intertwined with Jane's own conscience or alter-ego by Polly Teale in the script. However, what seems clear on the page as an 'idea' presented a challenge for staging, as the symmetry between the 'passionate' or 'mad' 19th century woman locked away from view for her own 'safety' and Jane's repressed fiery nature could easily become an academic observation and laboured on-stage. Rebecca and Elizabeth's dedication to developing a deep sense of emotional and physical connection between their characters has been instrumental in finding the heart of the play.

What message to take away? Jane Eyre inspires a personal response. The characters have resonated through time, embodying as Jane does, the many struggles of a female against a patriarchal society. But for me Charlotte Bronte's story does not end there. Jane's struggle is also a spiritual one - and therefore genderless. All can empathise with the child on the stool, alone and fearful, battling powerful and unkind voices. It was when the dying Helen Burns comes to Jane's aid in Lowood, reminding her of the 'invisible friends' that guide, that led to the idea of the ensemble 'guiding' Jane through the play, which has been the basis of the 'transitions' in the piece.

I feel very privileged to have the opportunity to direct Jane Eyre at Hever Festival Theatre first and then The Minack Theatre, Cornwall. Each venue will add that extra layer of atmosphere, to enhance the telling of Jane Eyre's journey.

Other Minack productions she has designed include **Gulliver's Travels**, **Moby Dick**, **Return to the Forbidden Planet**, **The Clockmaker's Daughter** and **Me & My Girl**. She also designed costumes for **Bugsy Malone** (the adult version) at the ApolloTheatre, Isle of Wight and **Curtains** at the Shaftsbury Theatre, Dawlish. Di designed and made costumes for **Coram Boy**, a joint production by the Mitre Players and Trinity School. Since last September she designed and made original costumes for **The Wind in the Willows**, performed at Trinity School by The Mitre Players, followed by **Shrek**, **The Musical** for Trinity School – a cast of 65 and directed by Chris Chambers. Her designs for **Jane Eyre** have evolved through discussion with the cast and director. A multi role piece needs careful costume plotting and the mixture of modern and period costume enables the cast to move seamlessly from scene to scene. When not designing costumes Di directs plays, most recently **A Bunch of Amateurs**.



Producer's Notes - Nicky Chambers








I am delighted to have this opportunity to produce this wonderful adaptation of Jane Eyre at two outstanding open-air theatres - the amazing **Two Sisters Theatre** at Hever Castle and the world famous and very beautiful **Minack Theatre**.

I first came across Polly Teale's work about 35 years ago performing in her play Now You See Me which follows the growing up and friendship of two young girls. I remember what fun I had acting alongside my life-long friend Mandy Benstead on a climbing frame. It would be a very different play today with social media contributing to young people facing so many anxieties and mental health struggles. But the essence and beauty of the teenage experience of developing special relationships will always be the same. Later, at Drama School, when I was cast in Polly Teale's adaptation of Jane Eyre, I saw how the adaptation focused on the development of another special relationship (between Jane and her own inner-self). I was moved by the sadness of her story, but also her indefatigable resilience, overcoming traumatic challenges again and again. Her fiery spirit resonated with me.







In spite of Bronte's 19th century story, and the passing of over a hundred and fifty years, women are often still driven to suppress their true feelings and scared to truly be themselves.

One of the complete and utter joys of producing and acting in this production is sharing the rehearsal room with so many wonderfully strong and creative women, all with something unique and passionate to offer. We hope you will

enjoy this production of Charlotte Bronte's classic story in an interpretation that rejoices and celebrates the strength and power of womenkind.


